Re: National Prescription Drug Take Back October 28, 2017

The Glenville Police will be participating with the upcoming fourteenth National Prescription Drug Take Back Day. The Take Back Day is scheduled for Saturday, October 28, 2017, from 10a.m. to 2p.m. and provides an opportunity for the public to prevent pill abuse and theft by removing from their homes potentially dangerous expired, unused, or unwanted prescription drugs.

During the thirteenth Take Back Day event this past April, DEA along with more than 4,200 law enforcement and community partners collected more unused prescription drugs than any of the 12 previous National Prescription Drug Take Back Day events. The April event brought in 900,386 pounds (450 tons) at close to 5,500 sites across the nation.

Once again the Glenville Police will provide a way to dispose of your prescription drugs at our station. You will be able to drive up in your vehicle and hand the drugs to an officer.
