

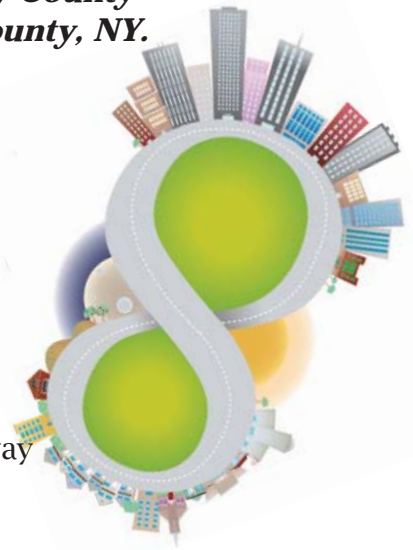
Airport Business Park *Fast Facts*

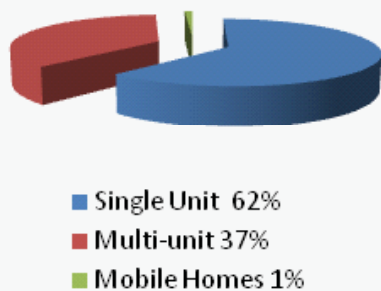

Occupied Housing Units:



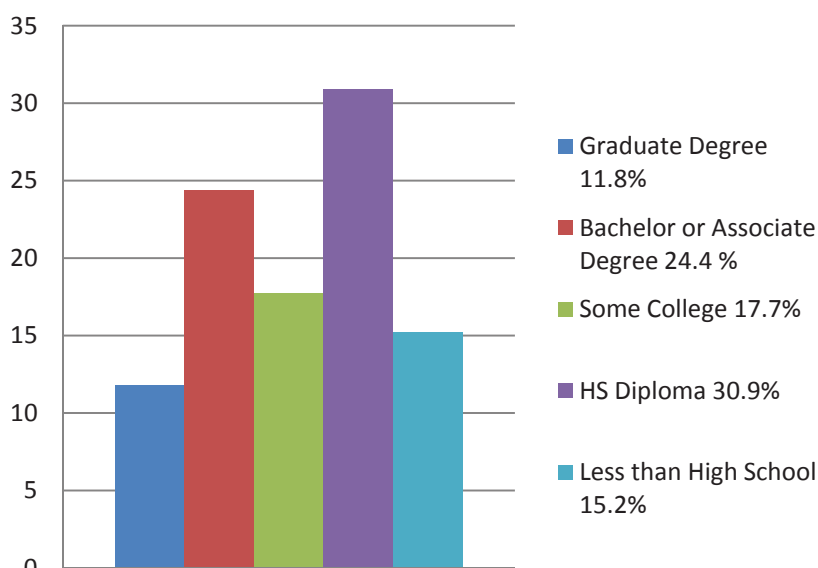
EDUCATION

- Downtown Schenectady is home to four Institutions of higher education: Union College, Union Graduate College, Schenectady County Community College (SCCC) and the Schenectady campus of Empire State College. There are 8,254 students currently enrolled among the four.
- *Forbes* has ranked Tech Valley as one of the top three education regions in the nation. More than 40 colleges and universities dot the region with fields of study including high-tech, engineering, business, medicine and law.
- More than 50% of the graduates from SCCC and/or Union College graduate with degrees in fields of math or science.

RESIDENTS

- According to the 2008 U.S. Census Quick Facts, 151,426 people called Schenectady County home, and the 2006-2008 American Community Survey cites that 61,914 people called the City of Schenectady home.
- The mean income of Schenectady County residents was \$53,182 in 2007 according to the U.S. Census Bureau.
- Schenectady County contains 66,560 units of housing with a 91% occupancy rate.

ARTS, CULTURE AND RECREATION

- Schenectady is known throughout the region for its cultural venues and offerings. The county is home to Proctors (Main Stage, GE Theatre with iWerks screen, Key Hall, Onstage Media and the Underground), a resident ballet and symphony orchestra, two community theaters, 15 movie screens, art galleries, museums and numerous historic districts and sites including the Stockade, New York State's first Historic District.
- Schenectady is located on the banks of the Mohawk River/Erie Canal. In addition to biking, running, boating, skiing and snowmobiling, residents and visitors enjoy six golf courses, two skating rinks, numerous parks and a wide variety of special events all year long.
