EMERGENCY ORDER TO ASSIST LOCAL BUSINESSES EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY IN THE TOWN OF GLENVILLE

WHEREAS, Pursuant to New York State Executive Law Article 2-B, Section 24, subsection g, Supervisor Christopher Koetzle hereby issues a local civil emergency executive order that provides for suspension of the Town's temporary sign restrictions in response to Governor Cuomo's New York OnPause Order; and

WHEREAS, The Town's goal is to provide maximum flexibility for businesses re-establishing customer bases under reopening of phases I through IV by allowing temporary advertising signage and temporarily suspending town zoning code restrictions enumerated under section 270-71, titled "Temporary Signs" EXCEPT for the following subsections which address safety concerns:

- \$270-71A4 Temporary signs (with the exception of holiday decorations) will not be illuminated.
- §270-71A5 which prohibits temporary signs will not be placed in a position which obstructs or impairs traffic, or in any manner that creates a hazard or disturbance to the health, safety and welfare of the public.
- §270-71A6 Temporary signs are subject to the provisions of § 270-68 of this chapter; and

NOW HEREBY BE IT RESOLVED, That the enforcement of local ordinances relative to temporary signs, under section 270-71, titled "Temporary Signs" subject to the aforementioned exceptions, within the Town is hereby suspended through October 15, 2020 in five (5) day increments, with weekly reassessment of the suspension making this order subject to change; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That commencing this date, the Director of Community Development or her designated agent will review requests for educational purposes upon request.

Depending on how events unfold, this temporary order providing for suspension of zoning code restrictions on temporary signage may be extended. Town Supervisor Christopher Koetzle by this emergency order is addressing the unfortunate fact that many small business owners and employees have lost their jobs and business owners have lost significant income during NY ONPAUSE. Allowing for additional means to advertise in a safe manner, while following the applicable NYS regulations, will improve business conditions and create job opportunities in the Town of Glenville as well as provide its residents with safe activity during these difficult times.
