WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Public Works of the Town of Glenville has reported that the brush, grass and weeds at each of the cited properties exceeded 10 inches in height at each of the cited locations in violation of Chapter 99 of the Code of the Town of Glenville; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner caused each of the Property Owners, to be notified in accordance with Section 99-2 of the Code of the Town of Glenville of the requirement to bring their property into compliance with Section 99-1 of the Code of the Town of Glenville; and

WHEREAS, the Property Owners listed on the attached Schedule "A" having taken no steps to cut the brush, grass and/or weeds at the listed premises within the time period provided in the notice served, requiring the Commissioner to cause the brush, grass and weeds to be cut and removed at town expense; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner caused each of the Property Owners listed to be sent a bill for the removal of the brush, grass and weeds from the listed properties, plus the administrative fees provided for by Chapter 99 of the Code of the Town of Glenville and such charges and fees for the properties listed below remain wholly unpaid; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Glenville adopted a resolution calling for a public hearing on November 15, 2023 at 7:00 PM at the Glenville Municipal Center, 18 Glenridge Road, Glenville, New York to hear all persons interested regarding the proposed imposition of a lien upon the listed properties for the charges and fees stated; and

WHEREAS, having heard all persons at the public hearing held on this matter and after due deliberation thereon;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF GLENVILLE HEREBY FINDS AND DETERMINES THAT:

- 1. Brush, grass and weeds of a height in excess of 10 inches were found on the listed properties on the dates cited by the Building Inspector and/or Code Enforcement Officer.
- 2. That the Commissioner of Public Works of the Town of Glenville notified each property owner, in the manner provided by Town Code section 99-2, of the nature of the violations thereon and demanded that the brush, grass and weeds be cut and removed as required by Chapter 99 of the Code.
- **3.** That the brush, grass and weeds were not cut or removed from the listed properties prior to the dates required by the notices given.

- **4.** The brush, grass and weeds on the listed properties were caused to be cut and removed by the Commissioner of Public Works at town expense.
- 5. That the Town Board adopted a resolution calling for a public hearing regarding the proposed imposition of liens for the unpaid charges and fees associated with the cutting and removal of brush grass and weeds from the listed properties.
- 6. That the Town Board held the aforementioned public hearing on November 15, 2023 and heard all persons interested in addressing the Board on this issue.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that inasmuch as the property owners listed on Schedule "A" attached hereto have failed to comply with the requirements of Chapter 99 of the Code of the Town of Glenville within the deadlines established therein, the Town was authorized and empowered (by virtue of the provisions of the Town Code, Town Law, the New York State Property Maintenance Code, and other applicable provisions of law), to enter upon the premises and to cause the brush, grass and weeds to be cut and removed. The total expense of such work and removal shall be assessed by the Town Board on the property, and the expense so assessed shall constitute a lien and charge on the property on which it is levied until paid or otherwise satisfied or discharged and shall be collected in the same manner and at the same time as other Town charges.

WHEREAS, by resolution 108-2019, the Town Board of the Town of Glenville granted its consent to Champlain Hudson Power Express, Inc. ("CHPEI") developing the Champlain Hudson Power Express Project and the routing of certain facilities within the Town, as more particularly set forth in that resolution; and

WHEREAS, CHPE LLC and its wholly-owned subsidiary CHPE Properties, Inc. (collectively, "CHPE") is the successor to CHPEI; and

WHEREAS, CHPE intends to construct and operate a buried 1,250 megawatt High Voltage Direct Current electric transmission facility consisting of two solid-state cables and related equipment and appurtenances ("Project") pursuant to the Certificate of Environmental Capability and Public Need granted to CHPE by the New York State Public Service Commission ("PSC") on April 20, 2013 (as amended from time to time, the "Certificate"), the Project's Environmental Management and Construction Plan (as amended from time to time, "EM&CP") to be approved by the PSC in due course, and other permits and authorizations to conduct certain related activities, including Project construction and Project restoration activities as provided for herein (collectively, "Project Activities"); and

WHEREAS, in order to accomplish Project Activities within the Town, CHPE needs to install and operate buried cables in, across, and under certain Town Lands known as Tax Parcel ID 22.4-1-70 (the "Town Lands") and to cross over, under, or in close proximity to certain Town-owned collocated infrastructure ("Town Cl") (water, sewer, etc.); and

WHEREAS, the Town seeks assurances from CHPE that CHPE will pay and/or otherwise indemnify, defend and hold the Town harmless of and from any damage to the Town Lands and any other public infrastructure used or traversed by CHPE or its contractors to access the Town Lands for installation and maintenance of the Project in and under the Town Lands; and

WHEREAS, CHPE provided to the Town for review and negotiation a proposed CROSSING AGREEMENT FOR THE CHAMPLAIN HUDSON POWER EXPRESS ELECTRIC TRANSMISSION CABLE SYSTEM CROSSING ("Crossing Agreement") setting forth CHPE's and the Town's rights and obligations with respect to CHPE's installation and operation of buried cables in, across, and under certain Town Lands and in close proximity to certain Town CI, as more particularly set forth in the Crossing Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Crossing Agreement is intended to enable the development of the Project, as supported by the Town;

NOW, THEREORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town hereby approves the Crossing Agreement, and hereby authorizes the Town Supervisor to execute and deliver the Crossing Agreement and to perform all acts necessary or required in connection therewith.

WHEREAS, the Town caused to be prepared a map, plan, and report prepared by the Town's engineer, duly licensed to practice in the State of New York, Delaware Engineering, DPC, entitled "Town of Glenville: Water System Improvements," and dated June 2022 (amended August 2022) (the "Map, Plan, and Report");

WHEREAS, the Map, Plan, and Report set forth proposed improvements to the Town's Wastewater Treatment Plant and Water Distribution System consisting of: (i) upgrading the existing mechanical, HVAC, architectural, electrical and existing equipment on the older side of the Wastewater Treatment Plant; and (ii) the installation ductile iron piping necessary to provide Town water to customers in Water Districts 2, 3, 8 and 12 in order to increase water pressure, disconnect these customers from the

Village of Scotia water distribution system and replace those customers' lead water services (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, on September 7, 2022, the Town Board, having conducted a duly noticed public hearing, approved a resolution to increase and improve the facilities of the Town Water Districts in the amount of \$22,720,000; and

WHEREAS, subsequently, the Town unsuccessfully sought grant funding from New York State in order to support the Project and partially offset the costs to the Town's taxpayers thereof, and, given that Project costs would be substantial in the absence of additional financial support, the Town Board has, working with its designated engineer and involved staff, conducted a reassessment of the needs driving the proposed Project and has determined to proceed with certain Project improvements as part of separate actions; and

WHEREAS, among other things, the proposed Project would have extended Town water to certain areas of the Town, including portions of the Industrial Park and West Glen areas which are presently part of Water District 2 and supplied water by the Village of Scotia, and the Town is advancing a separate project to extend Town water to the Industrial Park and has negotiated an update to the intermunicipal agreement with the Village of Scotia concerning supply of water to portions of the Town, including the West Glen and other areas; and

WHEREAS, in view of the Town's progress advancing a program of required improvements the water supply system serving residents and businesses in the Town since passage of the aforementioned September 7, 2022 resolution, the increase and improvement contemplated by the September 7, 2022 resolution is no longer applicable;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board hereby nullifies its prior resolution 164-2022, duly adopted by the Town Board on September 7, 2022.
