Supervisor Koetzle called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM;

Supervisor Koetzle asked the Town Clerk, Linda C. Neals, to call the roll.

Supervisor Koetzle moved ahead with the resolutions:

RESOLUTION NO. 178-2019

Moved by: Councilwoman Wierzbowski **Seconded by:** Councilman Aragosa

WHEREAS, Chapter 242, Subdivision of Lands, section 242-3, Private roads, of the Code of the Town of Glenville provides that a developer of a subdivision of four or fewer single-family dwelling lots may propose a private drive; and

WHEREAS, Tony Hynes has acquired property on both sides of an 800 foot +/- stretch of Lover's Lane; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hynes has made application to have the Town abandon that stretch of Lover's Lane as he is the only property served by that road; and

WHEREAS, The Highway Superintendent has recommended that the portion of Lover's Lane be abandoned as in the best interest of the Town with savings in road maintenance and snow removal; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hynes has had the area containing the road surveyed, has prepared a legal description of same and will provide the Town with a turnaround at the new terminus of the public portion of the road in order to allow snow plow town trucks a safe way to turn around; and

WHEREAS, when the road is conveyed to him, Mr. Hynes would assume all responsibility for maintenance and repair; and

WHEREAS, in order to take advantage of the current paving season, Mr. Hynes proposes that he be permitted to pave the portion of Lover's Lane to be abandoned in a manner reflective of its proposed new status as a private driveway; and

WHEREAS, the Highway Superintendent has inspected the portion of Lover's Lane and the drainage structures associated therewith and the proposed manner of paving such road and has determined that while the paving would not done in a manner meeting Town road standards, they are suitable to serve the limited traffic for such private road if properly maintained ;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Glenville hereby grants the request of Tony Hynes for a waiver of the Town Road Standards pursuant to the authority granted the Town Board in Town Code with respect to the portion of Lover's Lane to be abandoned as a Town Road and the authority to pave such road, provided the applicant provides the Town proof of liability

and Workers Compensation insurance for his contractor and such work being inspected and approved by the Highway Superintendent, and it is further

RESOLVED that the parties will move expeditiously to effectuate the formal abandonment and transfer of the portion of Lover's Lane in question; and

IT IS STILL FURTHER RESOLVED that upon final approval of the abandonment and conveyance, the applicant shall cause to be erected, at his sole expense, appropriate signage, as determined by the Highway Superintendent, in accordance with NYS Law and the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices, designating the aforementioned private road and posting it as a private road.
